

Interwhat?

- The practice of directly interconnecting networks
- Cutting-out the Internet's middlemen



Why do we do it?

Improve network reliability or quality

- Reduce outages, peak-time congestion or latency
- It's often mutually beneficial
 - But not always SFI is not a *right*
- Of the 5 largest consumer ISPs, 4 peer widely
 - The UK is quite lucky in this respect
- Most content companies can't peer fast enough
- The peering community can be very valuable

What do you need?

Your own AS number, from RIPE


- And, ideally, some IP space you're permitted to announce. (You wouldn't steal a car, etc.)
- Some routers that speak BGP4
 - Ideally, one that can see the whole Internet
 - Usually, at least one 'IP transit' connection
- Some agreeable networks to peer with
- A cable for each one

Ooooorrr.... An Internet Exchange Point!

IXPs in the UK

• Essentially a large switch – good ol' Ethernet

- May span more than one data centre
- Facilitates one-to-many connectivity
- Route servers facilitate 'multi-lateral peering'
- Port speeds of 1G, 10G or 100G (or bundles thereof)
 - Some do 100Mbit, but... Please don't
- Mutual organisations, member-owned
- The LINX Juniper LAN is the 10,000lb Gorilla.
 - LINX is big, globally 3.2Tbit/sec of traffic



Outside the UK...?

Practically every major European city has an IXP

- AMS-IX in Amsterdam
- **DE-CIX** in Frankfurt
- France IX in Paris
- BNIX in Brussels
- INEX in Dublin
- 'Long-line' IXP resellers can get you anywhere
- Not all will be mutual, some are commercial
- Attitude towards 'open' peering may differ to the UK

In Summary

- If you're selling Internet services, consider peering
- When done well, peering can provide benefits
